409.0.0.0	GENERAL FIREGROUND OPERATIONS.
409.1.0.0	PURPOSE.
409.1.1.0	The purpose of this SOP is to discuss general fire ground activities. There are additional Standard Operating Procedures that address specific actions at fire and other emergency incidents.
409.2.0.0	SCOPE.
409.2.1.0	The requirements of this SOP shall apply to all fire companies, fire officers and firefighters. The words "shall" or "will" indicate a mandatory requirement. The words "should" or "may" indicate a suggested course of action.
409.3.0.0	SELF CONTAINED BREATHING APPARATUS (SCBA).
409.3.1.0	The following items are for general purposes only. Detailed requirements are found in the MFD Respiratory Protection Program, SOP 405.0.0.0.
409.3.2.0	The use of SCBA is mandatory at all fires, including dumpster fires, hazardous materials incidents, and heavy smoke conditions without fire, except as noted in Section 409.3.3.0.
409.3.3.0	The use of SCBA is optional, with the final decision left to the individual firefighters, at the following types of fires:
	a. Open fires
	b. Small trash fires
	c. Field and brush fires.
409.3.4.0	When the use of SCBA is required, its use shall not be discontinued until approved by Command. Testing equipment should be utilized in enclosed areas to verify there are no excessive hazardous gases before discontinuing SCBA use.
409.3.5.0	If there is any doubt about the need for SCBA, then its use shall be continued.
409.3.6.0	Firefighters arriving at the incident scene on apparatus shall have their SCBA in place and ready for operation, as well as the other required Personnel Protective

	Equipment. Personnel need not be breathing from the SCBA air supply until ready to enter the hazardous area.
409.3.7.0	When the SCBA low air warning activates, both the firefighter and his/her partner shall immediately exit the hazardous environment ("Buddy System") and report their status to the Accountability Officer. If their physical conditions permit, they may obtain full cylinders and return to their function after reporting to the Accountability Officer.
	Exception: If they are in the process of removing a victim when the SCBA low air warning activates, they may continue with the removal, if in their judgment, they have sufficient remaining breathing air to do so.
409.3.8.0	Firefighters shall not take unnecessary or unreasonable risks to effect a rescue. The safety of firefighters is paramount.
409.3.9.0	If it becomes necessary for a firefighter to exit a hazardous area, then his/her partner shall also exit. No personnel shall be left alone.
409.0.0.0	HOSE LINES
409.4.1.0	All interior fire suppression actions, involving fires beyond the incipient stage, shall be made with a hose line no smaller than 1.5" in diameter. It is better to have too much flow than too little.
409.4.2.0	When personnel have entered a hazardous environment, the RIT procedures shall be initialized. (See MFD SOP 408.0.0.0. Rapid Intervention)
409.4.3.0	When interior fire suppression actions have begun, a continuous water supply shall be assured unless Command permits otherwise. This may consist of a hydrant connection or water from another apparatus. A sufficient water supply is of the utmost priority and shall be established when the apparatus tank water level falls to one half. Exception: Hose lines supporting a human life rescue effort. In this event a water supply shall be established as soon as possible.

409.7.15.0	At rescue incidents, the medical personnel in charge of patient care shall be consulted for extrication recommendations.
409.7.16.0	Unless extraordinary reasons exist, no debris or vehicular fluids shall be removed or otherwise mitigated at the scene of a motor vehicle crash unless the action is approved by the investigating police officer. The original location of these items may be crucial in determining the cause of the crash.
409.7.17.0	If an apparent fire code violation is noted at a fire scene, the Incident Commander shall be notified.
409.7.18.0	Smoking by personnel is only permitted in designated areas.
409.7.19.0	As noted elsewhere in this procedure, there are other SOPs that provide more specific information concerning many of the topics referenced herein.
409.7.20.0	Should there be conflict between two or more SOPs, or between sections of an SOP, that section containing the most stringent requirements shall apply.
